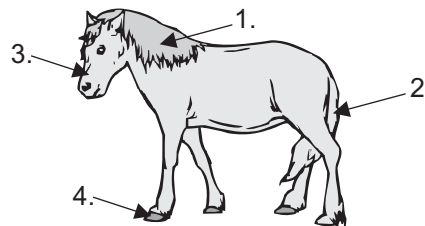

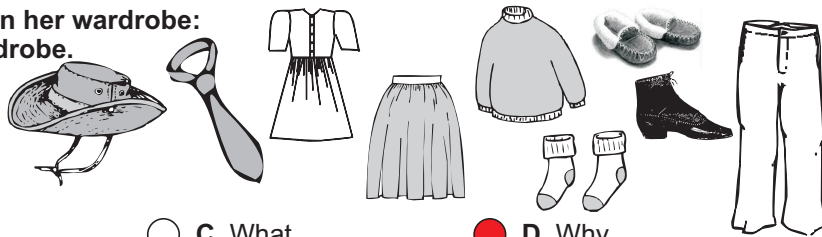

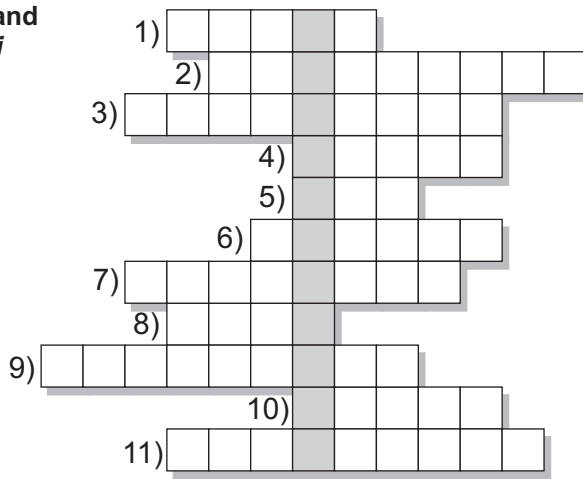

Margaret Thatcher was born in 1925 above a shop in a small town. Her father was a grocer. He worked very hard for little money. Margaret also worked hard, and she went to Oxford University, where she studied chemistry. In 1951 she married Denis Thatcher, a rich businessman. They had twins. The love of her life was politics. She didn't have much time for other interests. She became a politician in 1959, leader of the Conservative Party in 1975, and Prime Minister four years after that. She has a strong personality. A lot of people were afraid of her, and she was called 'The Iron Lady'.

In 1984 Irish terrorists bombed her hotel, but she survived. She was Prime Minister for eleven years. She finally resigned in 1990, but she didn't want to, and she was in tears when she left 10 Downing Street.
