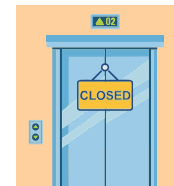
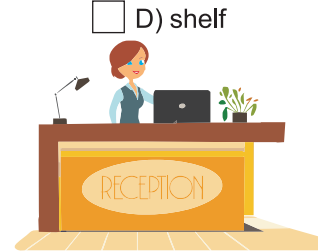

The train was named after a famous Russian doctor who lived in the nineteenth century.

Nowadays, the Matvei Mudrov visits each town or village on the BAM twice a year.
