Sylvia Earle is a well-known marine biologist, explorer, author, and lecturer.				
She was born in 1935. She has shown an interest in the ocean since her early childhood. In one of the interviews, she told about her first experience with it: "I was three years old and a big wave knocked me over. I wasn't frightened, I was excited."				
When she was younger, diving in the ocean was her passion. She spent lots of time underwater taking part in thousands of expeditions and being a leader of more than a hundred of them. She also set a record for solo diving in 1,000-metre deep water. In total, she has spent more than 7,000 hours underwater. Nowadays, because of her age and body condition, she rarely dives.				
In the past, Earle was in charge of lots of environmentally-friendly organisations. She did everything to protect the world around her. She explained:				
"When I went to the Gulf of Mexico in the 1950s, the sea was a big blue infinity. () Then, after thirty years, the blue paradise () and creatures disappeared from the Gulf."				
When she saw it, she felt sorry for the nature around her. It was hard to believe that within thirty years about ninety percent of sharks or turtles disappeared and the ocean became so polluted.				
Nowadays, in 2021, the situation is even worse. According to her, people should know the ocean is important for life on Earth. The living things in the water generate oxygen.
